Quick Tips for Supporting Students in the Hybrid Classroom

| Instead of | Try |
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| Writing on the board | Projecting a Google Doc and presenting your screen to the remote students |
| Round robin class discussions | Projecting the remote students on the board so the class feels their presence Encourage them to leave their computers "unmuted" so it is easier to hop in |
| Diving right into instruction | Spending a few minutes facilitating small talk with the entire class that includes remote students |
| Instructing right up until the end of the period | Ending instruction a few minutes early so you can check in 1:1 with the remote students - use this time to check comprehension, troubleshoot tech issues, and form a personal relationship |
| Requiring remote students to have their cameras on all the time | Offering specific opportunities or chunks of time, possibly during independent work, for students to get some time away from their cameras |
| Giving different tasks or work to remote and in-person students | Finding ways to have the remote students participate in the same way - film or share a video of a lab in science class, send home materials or a list of supplies for art class, etc. |
| Putting all the responsibility on the student to ask for assistance | Setting up structured opportunities for extra help and check-ins outside of class time. |
| Requiring students to be on their computers all day" | Considering ways to make elective periods of time away from the screen |
